To: All WSH Auditing Organisations and Auditors

<u>CIRCULAR ON THE CONDUCT AND SUBMISSION OF CONSASS AUDITS AND OTHER UPDATES</u>

All WSH Auditing Organisations (WSHAOs) and their auditors are reminded to carry out the mandatory Construction Safety Audit Scoring System (ConSASS) audit for worksites in a proper and thorough manner so as to ensure comprehensive assessment of the main contractor's workplace safety and health management system (WSHMS) implemented onsite.

- 2. WSH auditors are reminded that the ConSASS audit process comprises the following steps:
 - Opening meeting;
 - Familiarisation tour:
 - Assessment of WSHMS using the ConSASS checklist;
 - Verification of the effective implementation of the WSHMS, which includes review of documents, interview of personnel and physical inspection;
 - Evaluation of findings, which includes the remedial action plan of previous audit findings and WSHMS improvement plan; and
 - Exit meeting.
- 3. WSHAOs are also reminded to submit the ConSASS audit report package to Occupational Safety and Health Division (OSHD) via the iOSH e-Services for all the ConSASS audits carried out by their WSH auditors. The ConSASS report package shall include the following documents:
 - a) Completed ConSASS Checklist:
 - b) Completed ConSASS Interview Sheet;
 - c) ConSASS Score Card; and
 - d) Final ConSASS Audit Report covering the noteworthy efforts, findings and recommendations of the WSHMS, status of remedial action/ continual improvement along with other evidences and observations of the audit, etc.
- 4. In November 2016, the ConSASS checklist was revised to include additional requirement and guidance notes for heat stress prevention programme for Question numbers 3.6.21 and 3.6.38 as shown in Annex 1. With effect from 1 Feb 2017, all WSHAOs and auditors shall use the latest version of the ConSASS checklist which is available on MOM's website via http://www.mom.gov.sg/workplace-safety-and-health/safety-and-health-management-systems/submit-a-consass-audit.
