



# SINGAPORE WORKPLACE SAFETY & HEALTH REPORT

## Fatal Injuries




## Major Injuries





## Occupational Diseases (OD) Incidence




Construction, Manufacturing and Transportation & Storage remained the top three industries with the most fatal and major injuries in 2022.

■ Major Injuries



■ Type B - lower fatality risk    ■ Major Injuries



#### Slips, Trips & Falls




### 2nd Type A

#### Falls from Height




### 3rd Type B

[1] The breakdown for injury numbers by sector/industry follows the Singapore Standard Industrial Classification (2015) Version 2018

[2] Following the amendments to the Work Injury Compensation Act (WICA) which took effect from September 2020, employers need to report all work injuries with any instance of medical leave or light duties. From January 2021, major and minor injury numbers shared in WSH Report, 2021 would include injuries with at least one day of light duty or medical leave issued. Numbers presented under this new series are marked with [N].

[3] Since 2022, a new sub-classification for the Incident Type (Cause) of workplace injuries have been introduced to reprioritise the key areas of concern for better interventions. Incident Type (Cause) of workplace injuries will be further classified based on their fatality risks. Refer to Workplace Safety and Health Report 2022 for more details.
